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Learning to Love the Unlovely

Will Rogers is reputed to have said, "*I've* never met a man I didn't' like." Most of us cannot say that. And yet, as a Christian, many of us can honestly say, "I never met a man I didn't want to like." On the other

hand, one of the most common sins I find among us is "grudge holding".

I have seen this moral disease devour Christians. Hatred spreads throughout their very being. It causes one to lose the joy of his salvation. His peace with God slowly ebbs away. Soon the disease has spread into his "witnessing" and "stewardship". He begins to dry up and be but a semblance of what he used to be Spiritually. We cannot help but pity those who have been smitten by this spiritual malady.

An old High School friend wrote me sometime ago. She had asked me how to love the cruel. "How can I adjust my thinking to Christ-like thinking toward those who have sinned against me? How do you distinguish between the sin and the sinner?" These are pertinent questions. I do not know of anyone who has not grappled with them. The Christian must seek solutions for such questions.

FIRST – Visualize Christ dying on the cross because He loved this person in spite of his sin. He did do that, you know! Christ loved that person enough to die for him. He suffered the agony of the soul at Gethsemane for him. He accepted the mocking of Pilate's hall for him. He suffered the torture of Calvary for him. Can you not love him for whom Christ, your Savior gave His all? You love a pesky dog because your little boy loves him. Should you not love a man for whom God's Son died? How can you not love him whom Christ loves?

SECOND - Consider the potential as well as the present. The following illustrated concept may help. A man walked briskly into a sculptor's studio and saw an unfinished statue of Abraham Lincoln. It still looked a little unlike Lincoln, so he smashed it to smithereens. Another man walked aimlessly into the studio of a famous painter. An uncompleted picture of a beautiful woman was on the easel. He looked closely at the picture and saw it did not yet do justice to the one who had posed. He took the picture off the easel and lit a match to the canvas and watched it burn. In the first instance, a majestic statue may have been destroyed. In the second, a masterpiece of art may have been denied to the world. Why? Because they were not valued in their unfinished state. The people never gave enough time for the creators to complete their work. The kids today are wearing buttons that say, "Please be patient with me, God's not through with me yet." I like that concept. See the man you do not like as an unfinished creation of God.

THIRD – Look for the good points in the person you dislike and imagine how wonderful he could be if he surrendered his life to Christ. Imagine his abilities turned to Christ's work. Think what a powerhouse he could be if converted to the cause of Christ.

FOURTH – Pray for him earnestly. It is hard to hate one whom you are bringing before God's throne in prayer. Pray for his reformation. Pray that the "burr that is under his saddle" may somehow be removed. Let that prayer activate you into helping him locate that burr. Pray that you may see the reflection of God's image in him so that you may more easily love him. God's image in him is blurred by sin. Pray that the image might be restored.

FIFTH – Try to find why the person is as he is by inquiring into his background. Ugly experiences make ugly people. Was he mocked as a child? Did his parents reject him? Was he living in the shadow of an older sibling? What warped the personality? Then you may find yourself his sympathetic friend rather than his bitter enemy.

SIXTH – See yourself in this person. Have there not been times that you too were unfair and cruel? Are you not someone else's villain at times? Physical cruelty is sometimes not as cruel as mental cruelty. Pouting, revenge, coldness, unforgiveness, are sins more common and cruel than physical abuse. Are you always a loving person? Are you always the one who is ready to forgive? Are you perfect?

SEVENTH – Look at the person through the eyes of eternity. Do you wish him to be lost? Move toward him as you would toward one who unknowingly is about to plunge into Hell. When you have that interest, your compassion may be just what will transform him.

EIGHTH – Remember that he is not sin. He may be a murderer but he is not "murder". He may be an adulterer, but he is not "adultery". Love the sinner but hate the sin. Anger at sin is not wrong. Jesus became angry at the hardness of men's hearts when they complained that He healed on the Sabbath. He zealously drove men from the temple when they perverted it with graft. But He died for those men.

I do not believe I ever met a person in whom there was not some good, enough at least to respond to genuine concern. People often fight back at a cruel world they don't understand or that doesn't understand them. If they can ever comprehend the love of Christ for them personally, and if they can experience Christ's love through His Body, the Church, they can lose their frustrations and be transformed men.

Love produces love. God's kind of love is not loving the lovable but loving those who oppose themselves. This kind of love is really not produced merely by such arguments as I have given. It must be prayed for from the source of all love.

God is love.

Dear Brother Faull,



At the bottom of page 146 in the Eternal Struggle book, it says, "The priest could not drink wine while offering sacrifices; and our Lord refused to drink the wine he was offered on the cross, when He was offering Himself up as the supreme sacrifice."

One of our members read **John 19:29-30**, "29 A jar of wine vinegar

was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. 30 When he had received the drink, Jesus said, 'It is finished.'"

We looked at some other Scriptures from other Gospel books, but we could not settle the matter.

Do you have an explanation for the discrepancy?

We'd appreciate your comments.

ANSWER:

In **Leviticus 10:7** the priest was told not to drink wine (*Yagin*) nor strong drink (*shekar*, which is often very sweet and is where we get our word sugar) when they served as a priest.

Psalms 69:21 prophesied they would give gall (Heb. *Rosh*) and vinegar (*chemets*) to Jesus to drink. This Scripture was fulfilled in the following verses.

(The above words are Hebrew words, while the following words are Greek words.)

Mark 15:23 says they offered Jesus wine (*oinos*) mingled with myrrh (*smurnizo*). He refused it.

Matthew 27:34 says vinegar (*oxos*) mingled with gall (*chole*) was offered and He did not drink it.

Matthew 27:48 Offered vinegar (oxos) on a sponge. He drank it.

Mark 15:36 Vinegar (oxos) on a sponge. He drank it.

Luke 23:26 Vinegar (*oxos*) was offered by soldiers, but does not indicate if He did or did not drink it. He later said, "I thirst".

John 19:29 Vinegar (oxos) offered and He received it.

Notice He did not drink;

→ Wine (*onois*) He did not want intoxicating drink.

- → Myrrh (*smurnizo*) A narcotic. He did not want to be stupefied.
- Gall (chole) Bitter and some times a poison. He did not want to die of poisoning.

He did receive vinegar (oxos).

The Nazarite vow required that a Nazarite was not to drink wine or strong drink or the vinegar of wine or strong drink, nor liquor of grapes nor eat moist grapes or dried ones. Numbers. 6:3

However, Jesus was not a Nazarite, He was a Nazarene (from Nazareth). This verse shows clearly that wine and vinegar of wine, strong drink and the vinegar of strong drink, are not the same things.

The priests were not Nazarites and not forbidden as the Nazarites were to drink vinegar of wine or vinegar of strong drink. They were not forbidden all grape products as the Nazarites were.

Therefore, Jesus was not forbidden to drink from the sponge the ordinary everyday drink of the Roman soldier, which was the watered down vinegar.

It is not likely soldiers on duty were given to drink intoxicating drinks, but they may have drunk the vinegar of fruits, which as we have shown, was sometimes very sweet.

The history of vinegar says, "All that is necessary to make vinegar is to let wine-fresh uncooked cider or other fresh juices, stay uncorked. You will get a batch of vinegar in a week or so."

Another source says, "Romans made a vinegar called 'balsamic vinegar' and they made it from boiled grape juice. Balsamic vinegar is not wine vinegar and it has been made for thousands of years."

There is no way of knowing which Jesus was given.

So Jesus, our High Priest, did not violate the Levitical Law of the priest that served in the tabernacle, by partaking of the vinegar they offered Him on the sponge from someone who ran to quench His thirst.

It appears then, that He was offered wine and myrrh in the beginning and later was offered vinegar and gall. He refused both of these.

Later He drank of that which was not forbidden of a priest.

Besides, less than 24 hours before this He had drank of the fruit of the vine in the upper room. It was not grapes that were forbidden and so He was free to quench His thirst and still be our Savior.



Is Baptism Necessary?

Is it necessary to WHAT?

Many churches believe it is necessary to be a

member of their church but not to be saved. In other words, you have to do more to get into their church than you do Heaven.

Some believe it is necessary for parents to baptize their babies for the baby to go to Heaven. Pity the poor child that has unloving, careless, or ignorant parents.

Some believe it is necessary for parents to baptize their babies to keep the child from going into limbo, what ever that is.

Many churches believe it is necessary but not essential. What? Say that again! I thought those two words were synonymous. Evidently not but when I looked up the word "essential", the first definition was "absolutely necessary". When I look up "necessary," the first definition was "being essential". I guess words do not mean anything if it is a religious discussion.

Some people say it is necessary to be baptized to obey Jesus but not to be saved. Does that mean we do not have to obey Jesus to be saved?

Some say it is not all that important. Yet Jesus walked over 60 miles to be baptized of John to fulfil all righteousness, and He was not even a sinner.

Those who obeyed John's baptism were said to have justified God and those who did not were said to have rejected the counsel of God against themselves. Luke 7:29-30

As for me personally, I believe what Jesus said, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." This agrees with what He also said, "Except a man be born of the water and the spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God."

Is Baptism Necessary?

I guess it all depends if you believe your church or what Jesus says. I'd trust Jesus if I were you.

He is the one with the authority. He is Lord and He says "The words that I speak unto you will judge you in the last day."

In that day, it will not be your preacher sitting on the throne.



Dear Brother Faull,

I confronted my preacher about his plagiarism. He did not stop though he said he would.

The Elders rebuked him, but after they called a Bible College who said plagiarism is an accepted practice today, they would not do anything about it.

What is your opinion?

ANSWER:

A Bible College cannot give us permission to steal.

The sermon that I preached this morning had two illustrations that I had read in a couple of sermons. I never gave credit because I did not know who told the correct version of the story.

If I quote, I usually say, "Someone has said...". I do not always give the author because it is probably not original to him.

President Reagan used an Abraham Lincoln story that Lincoln did not give. He credited Lincoln and everyone said he was an uneducated bumpkin.

Kennedy's famous, "Ask not what your country can do for you, etc.," was not his but someone else's.

There is an old saying, "He who never reads will never be read and he who never quotes will never be quoted." That is true, but with the Internet, one should not attribute things to someone because it is probably not theirs.

Better to say like Paul, "One of your own prophets has said"...and then he quoted it. I say, "Someone has said..." and so that shows the thought was not original with me.

A famous preacher among us, with permission preached another well-known preacher's sermons. One time he was preaching and he said something and said, "Wait a minute....that's not what I believe." Of course everyone laughed.

One good brother says using another man's sermons allowed him to preach another five years. Once he preached somewhere and then the author of the sermon came and preached the same sermon. They accused the author of doing almost as good as the copycat. That's the problem. One of these days your preacher will be caught by others and then his influence will be hurt.

Someone has said, "If you quote it word for word, that is plagiarism. If you take several men's sermons and put them together, it is research".

Most preachers do research and as long as he does not steal it and pass it off as his own, I don't get bent out of shape.

If it's from a sermon book, it was meant for others to preach. Obviously you could not call that stealing. It is still wrong to plagiarize and pass off material as if it was your own original idea.

However, remember that we often forget where we learned something. But if it is "word for word", "scripture for scripture", "illustration for illustration", and not studied out, it is deceptive.

The college is wrong.

I could name a half a dozen preachers who were fired for doing exactly what you say. Some were men who preach in very large churches. Sometimes the other staff members will warn the man if they catch the preacher doing it again that they are going to expose his practice.

Now, I tell my students, "Use my material, but don't give me credit".

I have several enemies and they will reject truth just because the idea came from me. I tell them, "If it's worth using, then use it." I probably heard it somewhere along the line and do not even recall it. Who remembers where they heard a joke or an illustration?

Imitation is the greatest form of flattery.

I have a sermon called "Joe Brown's Funeral". Dozens have preached it. I am not offended but flattered and I have given wholesale permission for anyone to use it. I do not want my name mentioned every time because then people would begin calling their preacher "Faull-ites". I do not want that. So there are two sides to the story.

Many take Baptist preacher's sermons and just add water. This is especially dangerous because false doctrine can creep into the sermon and if he is not studying it for himself, then he might not be smart enough to catch the error.

In my opinion, to steal another's sermon without permission and to tell the illustrations as if they happened to you or lead people to think you originated the main idea, is stealing.

I would discourage it.

There are things I want to do today rather than have communion with Jesus who said, "Do this in remembrance of Me."

There are people I prefer to be with than experience His

presence as He promised. "Where two or three are gathered in My name there am I in the midst of them."

There are other gatherings more important to me that prompt me to disobey the command, "Do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some do."

There are other events that just seem more important than the events that will take place there today. I do not figure I am going to miss much.

I just do not think that my being there is more important than the sleep that I missed due to the important engagement that I had last night which kept me out so late.

I just feel the enjoyment of the sports event that I am attending today has much more eternal consequences than listening to the Word, communing with the Lord, and edifying the other Saints.

I cannot see that missing the assembly is going to make people question my commitment, ruin my influence, cause someone else to stumble, or why it should discourage other believers. Am I my brother's keeper?

There is only so much time in a week. I have places to go, people to see, things to do, events to attend, and a living to make. I think that I should seek them first before I seek the Kingdom of God or His righteousness.

I think it's nice that you took hours preparing a Sunday School lesson or a sermon or worked on a special number, but I just do not have time to be there and listen to it.

I was there this morning. After all, Jesus did not demand us to be there twice on the Lord's Day. I fulfilled my obligation, so the rest of the Lord's Day is mine to do with what I want. I feel closer to God in my bass boat on a nice calm lake, walking in a beautiful woods hunting, or relaxing out on the golf course than sitting in church. I think that worship is all about me and my feelings about God.

So when you see my pew empty, do not think I am unfaithful, just realize that I have a different set of priorities than perhaps you do.

I am glad that you are there to keep the doors open though, so that when I do not have somewhere else to go, someone else to see, or something else to do, I can stop by and worship the Lord with you!
