You made a very astute statement that there is just one difference between you and a Roman Catholic.

What is that?

Answer:

If one can prove that Peter had primacy over the other apostles, and that he was ever a Pope with universal domination over all Christendom, and that supremacy and headship passed by God's authority to the Pope of Rome, then I will become a Catholic.

If the Pope holds such an office today as God's unique spokesman instead of a usurper of God's authority, then he would have the right to decide everything, which we Christians disagree with the Catholic Church.

I maintain that Peter never had supremacy over the apostles, or that he was ever a Pope, nor that he had any successors to his authority, especially at Rome.

I believe that the Bible is an all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, not the Papal imposter.

This is the difference between a Catholic and a Christian.
